*To the Governors and Subscribers.*

The Committee of Management have the pleasure of submitting for your consideration the report and balance-sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1892.

By comparing the Balance-sheet with those of previous years, you will be pleased to notice that the receipts have been kept up to the general standard, and at the close of the present financial year the Bank Account is in credit.

It will be observed from the Balance-sheet submitted, that the sum of £335 18s. has been expended on the Asylum Buildings, three separate flights of stone stairs and a covered way having absorbed £440 of that amount; the balance has been laid out in making sundry alterations and additions suggested by Mr. Brett, the Inspector of Public Charities. The Committee feel confident that the Governors and Subscribers will be pleased with all the improvements effected whenever they visit the Institution. Great care and economy has at all times been exercised in carrying out these necessary improvements at the institution.

Mr. Brett, Inspector of Charities, paid his annual visit to the Asylum on the 9th February, 1892, and he reported that "The improvements effected since my last visit have contributed to the efficiency of the Institution, and whilst the Asylum on the whole was clean and in order, I took the opportunity to mention to the Superintendent some minor improvements," which the Committee have since carried out.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 284, or 7 more than that of the previous year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1891, was 223 males and 65 females; total, 288. The number admitted during the year was 108 males and 101 females, total, 209; total of all, 497. Of these, 105 males and 99 females have been discharged (47 males and 8 females of whom have died); total, 204, leaving in the Asylum at the end of year 226 males and 67 females; total, 293. The average cost of maintenance per head for the year has been £17 15s. 2½d. as against £17 10d. 8¾d. for the year ending June 30th, 1891.

### LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number of cases admitted during the year was 50, three adults remaining from the previous year; total, 53 adults. Forty-eight children were born (20 males and 26 females), 2 being still-born, and 47 adults and 44 infants discharged, leaving 6 adults and 1 infant in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1892. The death of 1 infant occurred during the year in this department. The average period spent by these patients in the Institution was 34·81 days.

The value of produce derived from the garden for the past year, estimated at market rates, amounts to the sum of £203 2s.; vegetables supplied to the Asylum amount to £189 2s. 6d., and the surplus sold realised the sum of £13 19s. 6d.

### OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended in out-door relief during the year was £2032 18s. 6d., showing a decrease of £23 1s. 7d., as compared with the previous year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1891, was 382 adults and 178 children—total, 560; and for the year ending 30th June, 1892, 377 adults and 199 children, being a decrease of 5 adults and an increase of 21 children, or a total of 576. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child was £3 10s. 7d., and per week, 1s. 4½d.

The Committee regret that they have to record the loss, by death, of the late Superintendent, Mr. William Henry Boughen, who had been a long and faithful servant "for a period of 33 years," having had charge of the Asylum since its inception.

Mr. David Atkinson, the new Superintendent, has now full oversight and charge of your Benevolent Asylum, under the direction of the President and Committee, who are pleased to observe that order and cleanliness prevail to an eminent degree throughout all the various subdivisions of your large and noble Institution.



For a long time past it has been thought inexpedient and undesirable that the various Members of your Committee of Management should annually retire from office *in globo*; but that some better method should prevail, such perhaps as that enforced by the Government on Incorporated Institutions in Ballarat, having charitable objects in view similar to your own. After duly considering the subject in Committee, a resolution was unanimously passed to the effect that it is desirable that but one-third only of your existing members should retire every year. This view was afterwards submitted to a Special Meeting of Governors and Subscribers called for the 27th June last, and agreed to without a dissentient voice.

The gratuitous labours of the Honorary Medical officers are thankfully remembered.

Collections in aid of the Institution, made at various Churches by Ministers and Congregations, are gratefully acknowledged.

The Committee duly appreciate and cordially thank the Ladies' Visiting Committee, and all the ladies who have kindly contributed to the comfort and happiness of the inmates and out-door recipients during the year.

To those who have kindly taken an interest in the Institution by getting up entertainments in various ways, and assisting to augment the funds, have the special thanks of the Committee.

The Committee cordially thank the local press for the cheerful manner in which publicity has been given to their transactions during the year.

To those who have kindly and gratuitously supplied the inmates with newspapers, journals, books, fruit, &c., are thankfully remembered by the Committee.

The Committee again accord their thanks to the Secretary, Superintendent, Matron, and other officers, for their constant attention in the discharge of their separate duties.

The Committee have reason to congratulate the community on the absence of any special hardships in our midst, the general distress prevailing throughout the country having but slightly affected this district, and though the exceptional severity of the present winter, and lack of employment in consequence, have had a somewhat depressing effect upon a section of the laboring classes, yet on the whole, thanks to your liberality, they (the Committee) were able to cope with the difficulty, and no deserving applicant for relief has been dismissed empty-handed.

The Committee conclude with the hope of more prosperous times in the immediate future, and sincerely trust that the liberal support accorded by you to this noble Institution will, with the help of Providence, be continued as heretofore.

# RULES

OF THE

## Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum

Adopted by the Governors, 24th January, 1867.

---

### OBJECTS:

TO RELIEVE THE AGED, INFIRM, DISABLED, AND DESTITUTE, AND TO MINISTER TO THEIR NECESSITIES, ACCORDING TO THE ABILITY OF THE INSTITUTE.

---

### LIFE GOVERNORS.

1. Every donor of £10 and upwards; every person not being a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections, in one year, the sum of £20 or upward from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum; any person appointed by any society paying the sum of £20; the executor, or, if more than one, the first named in any will, by which bequest of £20 or upwards shall be paid to the Institution, shall be Life Governors, and any other person elected at a meeting of Governors, on the recommendation of the Committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the Institution shall be a Life Governor and entitled to vote.

### ANNUAL GOVERNORS.

2. A donation of not less than £20 from a Shire Council, Road Board, or Municipal Council, shall entitle the Mayor, President, or Chairman of the Body donating, to be an Annual Governor. Every subscriber of £1 and upwards annually, shall be an Annual Governor, to date from the time of paying such subscription, and entitled to vote at all yearly and other special meetings of Governors; provided in the case of a new subscriber he shall have paid his donation or subscription seven days before such meeting.

3. The Institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, three Honorary Medical Officers, and sixteen Governors. In the month of July in every year, one-third part of

the elected members of the Committee shall go out of office, except the Trustees (but may, nevertheless, be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; or when two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

4. If any member of Committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the President of the Asylum, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or become convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of Committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto a qualified contributor to the Asylum until the next Annual Meeting for the election of the Committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire, in addition to those herein before provided for, except in the case of a Trustee or Honorary Medical Officer, who must be elected at a General Meeting of the Governors.

5. The Annual Meeting of the Governors of the Institution shall be held in the month of July in each year, when a general report of the affairs of the Institution, from the Committee of Management, shall be submitted for consideration, and the necessary elections proceeded with.

6. It shall be competent, at any time, for the President to call a Special Meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition, signed by eight members of the Committee of Management, or twenty-four Governors, requiring him to do so, on giving seven days' notice in one or more of the Ballarat daily papers of such meeting and requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such Special Meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

7. At the Annual or other Special Meeting of Governors, ten Governors shall form a quorum; but if after the expiration of half-an-hour after the time appointed for such meeting, a quorum be not present, the Governors then present shall have the power to adjourn such meeting, and to appoint a time within seven days when such adjourned meeting shall be held.

8. The Committee of management shall manage and direct the general business of the Institution; shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules; appoint and discharge all salaried officers and servants of the Institution; shall meet one day in each month, and at other days as they shall appoint; admit and discharge patients, and make rules and regulations respecting them and their treatment; and shall

appoint Sub-Committees for all necessary purposes, and Auditors. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting, but not a deliberative vote.

9. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer shall be members *ex officio* of all Committees.

10. All Sub-Committees shall have at least five members, three to form a quorum.

11. The accounts of the Institution shall be audited in the month of July in each year.

12. Any member of Committee of Management (except the Trustees and Honorary Medical Officers) absenting himself for two months without assigning a reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the Committee and another shall be appointed in his stead.

13. No member of Committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have a pecuniary interest.

#### TREASURER.

14. All moneys received on account of the Institution shall be paid into the Bank appointed by the Committee of Management, to the credit of the Treasurer of the Institution, and shall be appropriated to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

#### SECRETARY.

15. The Secretary shall attend all Annual, Special, and Committee meetings; take minutes of all the proceedings transacted at such meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose; and carry out all the directions of such meetings in all particulars incident to his department.

16. The Secretary shall collect subscriptions and all moneys to or receivable by the Institution, in all cases giving receipts, and shall within fourteen days of the time of receipt of moneys, pay over the same into the Bank to the credit of the Treasurer, submitting at each meeting to the General or Executive Committee an account of the sums and names of the person from whom the same have been received.

17. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of his department; keep the accounts of the Institution, under the direction of the several Committees; compile all reports of the Committees; fill the cheques, and perform all the clerical duties connected with the Office of Secretary.

## HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

18. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution shall be duly qualified Medical Practitioners, and shall attend when required, the rotation of duty to be left to themselves ; shall have access to the Institution at all times ; perform all surgical operations and record the same in a book kept for that purpose at the Institution.

19. Any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting his duty without reasonable cause shall cease to hold office.

Any five Governors wishing to make any alteration in the Rules, shall give the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice, requesting him to give due notice of such intention to the Governors.
