*To the Governors and Subscribers,*

The Committee have the honor to submit their Fortieth Report of the Asylum, and of the work performed during the past year.

Owing to the cost of provisions being largely in excess of former years, and the persistent falling off in the revenue, the Committee found it absolutely necessary to further encroach upon the Reserve Fund to the extent of within a fraction of £2000, to enable them to meet the current expenditure of the year. A glance at the accompanying balance sheet will show the cost of two items alone—flour and meat to have been £961 17s 6d and £1425 9s 9d respectively, as against £775 3s 2d and £1218 9s 10d for the year 1895-6, or an increase of £398 14s 3d.

The following statements will convey to you the great amount of work discharged by the asylum, in affording relief for the suffering poor of the City, Town, and Country.

The daily average number of inmates for the year has been 343·84, being 2 more than that of the previous year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1896, was 261 males and 74 females; total, 335. Admitted during the year, 103 males and 96 females; total, 199; total of all 534. Of these 97 males and 88 females were discharged, including 51 males and 16 females who died, leaving in the Asylum at the end of the year 267 males and 82 females; total, 349; being an increase as compared with the number remaining in the Asylum at the close of last year of 6 males and 8 females. The average cost of maintenance per head has been £14 1s 5½d as against £14 7s 2¼d for the year ending 30th June, 1896; but taking the supervision of the outdoor relief into account, the cost per head is reduced to £13 2s 4½d for the past year. During the year upwards of 1000 tramps have been given a substantial meal who are not mentioned at all. Computing these meals at the low value of 4½d, the average cost per inmate is further reduced by about one shilling each, or, say, £13 1s 4d. Nothing less than the practice of the strictest economy on the part of the Superintendent and Matron could have achieved a result so satisfactory in a trying year such as has just been passed.

#### LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number of cases admitted during the year was 43, four adults and one infant remaining from the previous year, total, 47 adults and one child. 37 children were born, viz., 13 males and 24 females. 40 adults and 34 infants were discharged, and 2 died, leaving in the institution 7 adults and 2 infants on the 30th June, 1897. The average period spent in the Asylum by each patient was 36 as against 38·34 days in the previous year. Mrs. Sheldrick many years nurse of the Maternity Ward having resigned, Mrs. Davey has been appointed in her place, and is giving general satisfaction.

#### OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended in out-door relief was £2987 2s 6d, showing an increase of £442 11s 0d as compared with the previous year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1897, was 551·78 adults and 221·19 children; total, 773·27, as against 583·88 adults and 288·86 children; total, 831·42 for the previous year, being a decrease of 32·10 adults and 67·67 children. The average cost per head per annum for adult and child was £3 17s 1½d, and per week 1s 5½d, as against £2 18s 3¼d and 1s 1½d respectively for the previous year. Taking the supervision of the out-door relief into account it increases the cost to £4 3s 7d per head per annum, and 1s 7¼d per week, this

latter mode of calculating the cost per head for the out-door recipients is considered the correct and only just way to debit part of the supervision to the out-door relief account.

### FINANCIAL.

The bank overdraft at the beginning of the year was £938 17s 1d. The revenue from all sources amounting to £6814 16s 5d, and the sum of £1999 19s 4d, taken from the Reserve Fund, make the total sum debited to cash £8814 15s 9d. The expenditure for the year as shown by the Balance Sheet is £7879 9s 1d, which, together with the overdraft from last year, totals, £8818 16s 2d, or £3 10s 5d in excess of receipts.

### REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR OF PUBLIC CHARITIES.

The Inspector visited the Asylum on the 26th January, 1897, and reported "That the institution and grounds are kept in perfect order, and reflect the greatest credit upon the Committee and their officers, in fact, for an institution having so many inmates, the care and cleanliness evinced took me quite by surprise, and must be of great value in making a healthy and cheerful home for the inmates. The books were neatly kept and duly audited, and the required certificate signed by the two Auditors. I checked the receipts and expenditure return with the books and found it correct. I notice for the last two years that the cubic space allowed for inmates has been getting lower and lower. This shows a tendency to overcrowd the institution, and can easily be remedied by not filling up vacancies till a fair average cubic space is attained."

### SPECIAL EFFORTS.

The Committee desire to acknowledge with grateful thanks the following liberal donations and special efforts:—The Sunday School Tribute, per Ballarat Ministers' Association, per Rev. W. H. Lewis, £108 2s 2d; The Queens Birthday Carnival, per Messrs W. D. Hill and T. Saunders, £162 2s 6d; part proceeds of the Chinese Football Match, per W. Stephens, £60; proportion of profits of the Military Tournament, per F. J. Sauer, £38 5s 0d; Chinese donation per Chow Mong, Mon Sing, Lu Ping, and Po Shi, £30; The Ballarat District Teachers' Association, per F. M. Bradhurst, £23 4s 4d; The Masonic Choral Service, per R. L. Nicholl and W. H. Kingsbury, £20 0s 0d.

We desire especially to convey our cordial thanks and recognition to Messrs Saunders and Hill, also the Superintendent and Matron, for the manner they have organised and carried to a successful issue the Queen's Birthday Carnival, realizing the handsome sum of £164 1s 6d, and in this connection a meed of praise should also be accorded to the old inmates who entered zealously and heartily into the work by disposing of a large number of tickets for admission to the Asylum and grounds, thereby contributing materially to the success of the affair. So satisfied are the Committee with the result of this their second effort in that direction that it has been decided to hold a similar demonstration on every recurrent 24th May.

The liberal manner in which the public responded to our appeal for subscriptions toward the Jubilee Fund merits special mention, over £68 having been thus contributed, enabling us to regale the inmates with special fare, a liberal distribution of tobacco and other luxuries, as also the out-door recipients, on the auspicious occasion of her Majesty's Jubilee, on the 22nd June.

Our cordial thanks are accorded to the Ladies' Visiting Committee who have contributed to the consolation, comfort, and welfare of the inmates; also to the local press for giving publicity to our proceedings and general requirements.

The best thanks of the Committee are due to the Hon Physicians, Drs. Mitchell and Jordan, Hon. Oculist, Dr. Guthrie, and the Hon. Solicitor, Mr Chas. Salter, for their kind services rendered.

The Committee desire to thank the Ministers for attending to the spiritual wants of the inmates, and for the collections made at their various Churches on behalf of the funds of the Asylum.

The kindness of those who have contributed to the comforts of the inmates is gratefully appreciated.

The business of the meeting will be to elect a president, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and nine members of Committee, in place of those who retire, viz., Messrs J. Oddie, J. Phillips, D. Cooke, M. C. Carey, Geo. Lovitt, C. B. Retallack, J. MacLeod, J. N. Dunn, and Rev. T. R. Cairns, but who are eligible for re-election; also the three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors.

#### GENERAL.

Your Committee have long seen the necessity of the institution being possessed of a piece of land to grow our own produce. Thanks to one of our inmates, and the courtesy of the Lands Department, we have come into possession of 7 acres of fair land which we are now utilizing to grow potatoes and raise pigs. This is only a small beginning in farming, but it is hoped that in the near future the Government will give us a larger piece, so that we can employ all

our own men who are able to do a little work, (although there are only a few who can do much work), but for those who can, this would be a healthful and profitable employment.

In closing the report the Committee would call the special attention of the subscribers and the citizens generally to the fact that, notwithstanding a number of special efforts, the liability is gradually increasing. This arises from the fact that a large number of citizens who ought to subscribe decline to do so, and if persisted in, this will no doubt lead to the imposition of a rate for the maintenance of all our Institutions. It would be greatly to be regretted if the poor rate system of the old countries should be introduced into the colony, and it is very earnestly hoped that during the coming year all who are in a position to do so will generously come to the aid of the Committee. The young people of the city and town, as well as the rural district, who are in regular employment, and all who are earning money, ought to give something to the relief of the poor. If this were done the Committee is assured that there would be no occasion to depart from a system which has worked very satisfactorily for the last 40 years.
