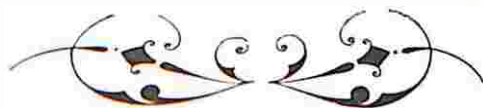

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1900.

To the Governors and Subscribers.

The Committee of Management have pleasure in presenting to you the Forty-third Report and Balance-sheet for the year ending the 30th June, 1900.

I.—THE ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 344·81, being 7·68 more than that of the previous year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1900, was 256 males and 88 females, total 344, being a decrease as compared with the former year of 6 males and 2 females, as follows:—

The average cost of maintenance per head was £13 17s. 0 1-9thd., as against £14 16s. 4 1-2d for the previous year.

II.—LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number of cases admitted during the year was 66; and 7 adults and 2 infants remaining from the previous

year ; total, 73 adults and two infants. 64 children were born, viz., 27 males and 37 females (also 4 still-born); 64 adults and 57 infants were discharged, and 3 infants died, leaving in this Hospital 9 adults and 6 infants on the 30th June 1900 ; the average period spent there was 39·22 days.

III.—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended in Out-door Relief during the year was £2204 5s. 6d, showing a decrease of £52 17s. 9d., as compared with the previous year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1900, was 494 adults and 135 children, total 629; and for the preceding year, 482·75 and 139 children, total 621·75 being an increase of 11·25 adults and a decrease of 4 children. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child was £3 10s. $\frac{1}{4}$ d., and per week 1s. 4 1-5d., as against £3 12s. 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. and 1s. 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. respectively for the previous year. The total number of persons receiving relief, both in-door and out-door, on the 30th June, 1900, was 976.

IV.—THE FARM.

The value of goods sold and received during the year from the Asylum's small farm at Brown Hill was as follows :—Goods sold, £369 6s. 2d.; goods used at the Asylum, £82 16s. 8d.; total, £452 16s. 8d.; and the expenditure for the same period was £413 12s. 2d. (including the sum of £53 expended in improvements), which shows a credit balance of £38 10s. 8d. The estimated value of stock, etc., on the farm on the 30th June, 1900, is £197. The farm, in addition to yielding a profit to the Institution, affords a means of employment for the old men who are able to do light work.

V.—FINANCIAL.

The Banking Account at the beginning of the year was in credit £904 7s. 5d, and the revenue from all sources amounted to £6982 3s. 6d.; total, £7886 10s. 11d. The expenditure as set forth in the balance-sheet is £7457 6s, leaving a credit balance in the Bank of £429 4s. 11d. The liabilities in salaries, wages, trade accounts, and deposits amount to £530 3s. 8d. The expenditure for the year has exceeded the revenue by £475 2s. 6d, in the general account.

VI.—REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR OF PUBLIC CHARITIES.

The Inspector visited the Asylum on the 4th August, 1899, and reported favourably on the Institution and its management.

The bequest of the late Mr. D. McNaught, of £100, less £7 16s probate duty, has been received and placed to the Endowment Account.

VIII.—OFFICE-BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF COMMITTEE RETIRING.

It will be the business of this meeting to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and nine mem-

bers of Committee, in place of those who retire by effluxion of time, viz.:—The Rev. T. R. Cairns, Messrs G. Lovitt, W. Gale, J. Phillips, J. Showman, W. Coltman, W. Dimsey, J. Long, and A. W. Hager, but who are eligible for re-election; also three Hon Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors.

IX —GENERAL.

The Committee desire to express their deep sense of the loss the Institution has sustained by death during the year of two of its members, viz —Mr J. T. Phillips, who had been connected with its management for upwards of twenty-five years, and Mr Edward Murphy for many years Mr James Long and Mr. A. W. Hager were elected by the Committee to fill the vacancies for the remainder of the term.

The gratuitous labors of the Hon. Medical Officers, Drs. Mitchell, Jordan, and Richards, Hon Oculist, Dr. E. Guthrie, Hon Solicitors, Messrs. Salter and Pinkerton, are thankfully remembered The Committee are also grateful to the Ladies' Visiting Committee, who have kindly administered comfort and consolation to the afflicted inmates.

Your Committee also desire to express their acknowledgment of the kind service rendered by many friends in forwarding contributions such as books, illustrated and other newspapers, tobacco, fruit, flowers, etc., for the use of the inmates, and they trust that they will continue these acts of kindness, which are greatly appreciated by the old people.

The thanks of the Committee are kindly given to the Ministers and Congregations who have so liberally contributed to swell the annual Charity Sunday collections.

The kindness of the local Press in cheerfully and voluntarily publishing the proceedings pertaining to this Charity is duly appreciated by the Committee.

As my term of office of President of the Asylum terminates this month, I desire to place on record the very great and unanimous support I have had from the Committee during my term of office. This has caused an exceedingly pleasant time for me, for without unanimity of feeling no Institution can succeed in that usefulness that

is necessary to alleviate the sufferings of the poor creatures who crave our assistance at all times in a city such as Ballarat. Soon after I came into office the epidemic of influenza broke out in the Institution and caused your Medical Officer a great amount of work; I therefore determined that I would get our poor people more attendance from our honorary staff. This was most cheerfully given by them when invited by your medical man, and regular visits have been made to the Institution. During this epidemic Dr. Holthouse himself was attacked and had to take a rest, and during his absence Dr. Mitchell attended to his duties, and I am extremely grateful to him for his ready response to Dr. Holthouse to take up his work.

During my term of office the first Carnival was inaugurated in aid of the Charities, and although it caused a very anxious time to its promoters owing to very bad weather, resulted in a profit of about £700, which was in a great measure due to the ladies, whose assistance was beyond all praise. This shows that given fine weather this means of raising money for the charities is always open to us, and should be resorted to once a year. Our share of the profits was nearly £300, a very gratifying result. I cannot close these remarks without referring to our own Carnival on Queen's Birthday, which notwithstanding adverse circumstances, owing to the unveiling of the Queen's Statue and other attractions, was a prominent success and has benefitted the Institution considerably. Its success was in a great measure due to the admirable work done by some of the old inmates under the direction of Mrs Atkinson, who canvassed the district in all directions.

In conclusion, I must allude to the admirable way the house is carried on by your Master and Matron, Mr and Mrs. Atkinson. Coming in close contact with them during the last year I cannot but admire the kindness and attention they devote to their charges, and in them the Committee have admirable and conscientious servants. I have also every reason to be satisfied with the work of the clerical staff, and the readiness of each officer to supply any information I might desire. I need not refer to the finances, as you will have them before you properly audited, and am pleased to think that you will find them fairly satisfactory considering the number of appeals that have been made on the Ballarat public during the past twelve months.

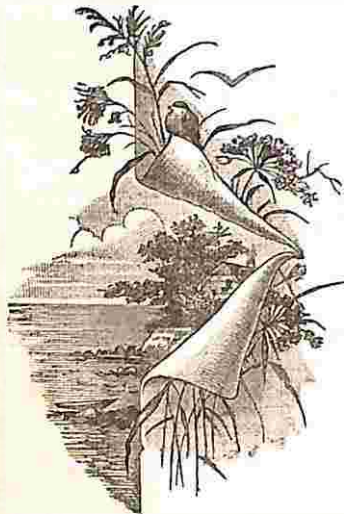
