*To the Governors and Subscribers.*

The Committee are pleased to report that the management and general supervision of the Institution have worked smoothly and satisfactorily during the year.

I.—THE ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 337.13, being 7.68 less than that of the previous year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1901, was 242 males and 82 females; total, 324, being a decrease as compared with the former year of 14 males and 6 females, as follows:—

The average cost of maintenance per head was £13 16s 0<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d, as against £13 17s 0<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d for the previous year.

## II.—LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number admitted during year was 55, and 9 adults and 6 infants remaining from the previous year; total, 64 adults and 6 infants. 48 children were born, viz., 21 males and 27 females (also 2 still-born); 55 adults and 50 infants were discharged; 1 adult and 2 infants died, leaving in the Hospital 8 adults and 2 infants on the 30th June, 1901. The average period spent there was 34·73 days.

## III.—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended on outdoor relief during the year was £2255 1s 2d, shewing an increase of £50 15s 8d, as compared with the previous year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1901, was 461·04 adults, 129·84 children; total, 590 88; and for the previous year, 494 adults and 135 children; total, 629; being a decrease of 32·96 adults and 5·16 children. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child was £3 15s 6d, and per week 1s 5d, as against £3 10s 1½d and 1s 4½d respectively for the previous year. The total number of persons receiving relief, both in-door and outdoor, on the 30th June, 1901, was 804. In addition to these and average number of 8 swagmen have been provided with dinners daily—2920 at 4d. each; totals, £48 13s 4d.

## IV.—THE FARM.

The produce sold £329 15s 2d, and produce sent to the Asylum £88; total, £417 15s 2d. Stock on hand at the close of the year valued at £170 10s. Grand total, £588 5s 2d. Total expenditure, including wages and improvements, £317 12s. Stock on hand from the previous year, £197; total £514 12s, shewing a profit of £73 13s 2d; by adding the sum £68 laid out on new buildings during the year increases the profit to £141 13s 2d.



## V.—FINANCIAL.

A credit balance of £429 4s 11d was brought forward from the previous year, and the amount received from all sources, as set forth in the balance-sheet, is £7102 1s 10d; total, £7531 6s 9d. Although great economy has been exercised in the maintenance and supervision of the Asylum, the expenditure has exceeded the revenue by £32 0 0s 1d, leaving a credit balance of £109 4s 10d on the 30th June, 1901.

## VI.—REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR OF PUBLIC CHARITIES.

The Inspector paid his usual yearly visit to the Asylum, and expressed his admiration at the general state of its efficiency and classifying it as a model Institution.

#### IX.—OFFICE-BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF COMMITTEE RETIRING.

This meeting will be called upon to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and eight members of Committee in place of those who retire by effluxion of time, viz., The Hons. J. Y. McDonald and Ham, M'sL.C., Messrs. J. Oddie, J. Coghlan, Wm. Scott, C. E. Grainger, D. Cooke, and J. McKay, but who are eligible and offer themselves for re-election; also, three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors.

#### X.—GENERAL.

The Committee expresses its regret at the withdrawal of Mr. O. E. Edwards, one of its old and energetic members who had, through failing health, resigned his seat at the Board. Mr. James McKay was elected by the Committee to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the year.

The revenue on the whole has been well maintained, but it will be noted that the Church collections are small this year in consequence of the Charity Sunday Collections having been deferred from time to time. There has been no Charity Sunday Collections during the past twelve months.

As President during the past year I have frequently summoned the special service of Dr. Mitchell, who has at all times kindly and promptly responded. Dr. Mitchell's residence being within a short distance of the Asylum, he has had the lion's share of honorary professional duties thrust upon him, and he has also attended daily at the Asylum during the absence of Dr. Holthouse through illness, which calls for special recognition, and we cordially thank him.

As the old medical instruments at the Asylum were condemned by the medical staff as out of date, a new complete set, with all the known modern improvements, has been obtained to the satisfaction of the Doctor.

The Chinese question is one that has greatly taxed the resources of the Committee, there being such a great number receiving out-door relief as compared with the small sum contributed by the Chinese of the district. The Committee thought that out of the number of 161 on the books, that if a muster was held at the Asylum a number might be struck off. A muster took place in the month of June, and an inspection was made, and all were considered deserving cases, and therefore had to continue their relief. The Chinese are a great burden on the Institution, and are likely to remain so for some time to come. The cost of providing for these poor creatures is £700 a year, and the private contributions received from the Chinese is only £14 to £15 a year. The difficulty in this matter is conspicuous in the fact that a great many of the white population actually refuse to subscribe to maintain so many Chinese. We cannot see a cure for it unless the better class of Chinese are compelled to subscribe more liberally towards keeping their poor.

The warmest thanks of the Committee are tendered to the Hon. Medical Officers, Drs. Mitchell, Jordan, and Richards; Hon. Oculist, Dr. Guthiel; and Hon. Solicitor, Mr. Pinkerton.

I would like especially to thank the Resident Surgeon for his assiduous care and attention to the inmates generally, and to the aged and infirm in the sick wards in particular, who constantly express their gratitude for his ministrations.

I am pleased to be able to bear testimony to the very efficient manner in which Nurse Freestone discharges the arduous duties in her department of our Institution; combining strong motherly regard and care with a proficient knowledge

of those duties which is recognised and endorsed by the whole of our medical staff.

Your Committee record its best thanks to the Clergymen of the different denominations who have contributed to the spiritual wants of the inmates, and also to the ladies who visit and offer comfort in kind greatly to the satisfaction and enjoyment of the poor old people.

Grateful acknowledgement is also made of the many musical and other treats given throughout the year to the inmates, affording great satisfaction, and tending to relieve their monotonous lives.

The Press is heartily thanked for its care and attention in publishing news to the advantage of the Asylum.

The Committee desire to bring before the subscribers the very valuable services rendered by the Superintendent, Matron, and Gardener in bringing the Birthday Carnival by their united efforts to a successful issue, and it recommends that Mr. and Mrs. Atkinson and Mrs. Saunders (Mr. Saunders being already a Life Governor) be made Life Governor and Governesses respectively of your noble Institution in recognition of the good work done.

Although the Carnival held on Boxing and other days turned out a failure financially, the promoters who labored assiduously for many weeks did their utmost in the hope of being rewarded by a substantial sum to hand over to the Charities, are accorded the very best thanks of the Committee.

As my term of office as President of the Asylum terminates this month, I desire to place on record the unanimous support and the cordial and consistent courtesy extended to me during the whole of that term by every member of the Committee.



Having the honor to preside over such meetings for the past twelve months has been a real pleasure to me, and my task has been rendered all the easier because of the very apparent desire of every member of the Committee to work always for the real welfare of the Institution, which, owing to its far reaching character, requires much discrimination and a constant attention to detail. The time we have spent in working thus together has been amply rewarded when we think of the many real cases of distress that have been alleviated during the past twelve months through the workings of the Asylum.

In saying this, I must not overlook the valuable and indispensable assistance rendered by the Master and Matron of the House, Mr. and Mrs. Atkinson. Their first thought has always been, not for themselves, but for the comfort and good of the inmates.

The clerical staff has also shown a commendable alertness whenever any information bearing on the Institution has been required.

Considering all the special appeals that have been made to Ballarat residents lately, the finances are in a fairly satisfactory condition, but, unfortunately owing to the introduction by the Government of the Old Age Pension system, many who have hitherto subscribed to our funds now hesitate to do so, and this matter must very shortly occupy the earnest attention of the Committee to retain our resources abreast of the expenditure.
