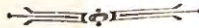

*To the Governors and Subscribers.*

In presenting the Report for the year ending 30th June, the Committee of Management are thankful to be in a position to announce a fair average year notwithstanding the persistent falling off of private subscriptions and other sources of revenue usually relied upon in years of prosperity. It was only marked attention to the judicious expenditure of the funds, and practice of economy, that enabled us to stave off a larger deficit than is displayed in the accompanying Balance Sheet, which shows that we have gone back only £135 12s. 1d. on the year's operations, having started the year with a Debit Balance of £413 8s. 3d., and on the 30th June last the deficiency amounted to £549 0s. 6d.

The total Income for the year is £6,057 3s. 5d., including Government Subsidy, £3,500; Expenditure, £6,606 3s. 11d., leaving a balance of £549 0s. 6d. on the wrong side of the ledger.

## I.—THE ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 322·57, being 10·14 more than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum, on the 30th June, 1905, was 259 males and 80 females, total 339, being an increase of 14 males and 7 females, as compared with the previous year.

The average cost of maintenance per head was £14 5s. 1/5d as against £14 12s. 1½d for last year.

## II.—LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number admitted during the year was 58 (2 adults and one child remaining from last year); total, 60 adults and one child. 50 children were born, viz: 24 males and 26 females. 1 male and 1 female child admitted. 54 adults and 49 children were discharged. 2 children died, leaving in the Hospital 6 adults and 2 children on the 30th June 1905. The average period spent there was 30½ days.

## III.—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended on out-door relief during the year was £1,197 15s. 9d., showing a decrease of £272 7s. 5d. as compared with last year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1905, was 225·84 adults and 131 children, total 356·84; and for the previous year 246 adults and 147·2 children, total 393·2, being a decrease of 20·16 adults and 16·2 children; total decrease of adults and children



36·18. The average cost per head, per annum, for each adult and child, was £3 7s. 1½d., and per week, 1s. 3½d., as against £3 14s. 11¾., and per week, 1s. 5¼d. for the previous year. The total number of persons receiving relief, both in-door and out-door, on the 30th June, 1905, was 676. In addition to these 1,725 dinners have been given to passing vagrants, taken at 4d. each, total £28 15s.

#### IV.—THE FARM.

The produce sold and sent to the Asylum totals £308 13s. 7d. Stock on hand at the close of the year valued at £305 7s. 6d. Farm property valued at £260. Grand total £874 1s. 1d. Total expenditure, including wages, horse feed, &c.; purchase of cows, pigs, poultry, farm improvements, rent and rates, £350 9s. 4d. Stock on hand from the previous year, £275 2s. The Farm property, valued at £260 on the 30th June, 1904, making a grand total of £835 11s. 4d., showing a loss of £11 10s. 3d. for the year.

#### V.—REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR OF PUBLIC CHARITIES.

The usual annual visit was made by the Inspector, who expressed general satisfaction with the good order prevailing in the Asylum, and cheerful and contented appearance of the inmates.

His seat on the Committee was filled by the appointment of his son, Mr. T. P. Long. In accordance with the Bye-Laws the seat becomes vacant, and Mr. T. P. Long, being eligible for re-election, has been nominated for the vacant seat accordingly.

It will be noted with regret that private subscriptions continue to fall off to an alarming extent, a fact that reflects little credit on our well-to-do fellow citizens, and others, who can afford to assist with donations if ever so small.

What a cry there would be were a Charity tax to become the law of the land, this, however, seems within measurable distance judging by frequent intimations on the subject by the Hon. the Premier, Mr. Bent, yet, and it cannot be too often repeated, we shall have only ourselves to blame were such reflections to be cast on the community as—disguise it as you may—it means nothing less than the veritable Old Country Poor Law.

The loss of population by death, and removals from the district, consequent on the lack of employment, have of late years sadly diminished our regular subscribers, and new ones have as yet failed to fill up the gaps. To the comparative few who are still on the roll of subscribers, the Committee is most grateful, for without their aid many deserving poor would necessarily have had to be neglected. In view, however, of the Mining revival now setting in, the promise of a bountiful harvest, and the prospect of an improvement generally throughout the district, the Committee confidently anticipate a better state of affairs in the immediate future.

Our thanks are due to the Ministers of the various Churches, and many lay workers (ladies, gentlemen, and young people), who look so well after the spiritual life and edification of our inmates; to the many kind and talented friends who have given entertainments; to our old friend, and Committeeman, Mr. Geo. Lovitt, for his constant efforts in connection with the tobacco fund, which is so well appreciated by the old folk; to many thoughtful and generous ones who have given books, magazines, and papers, as well as creature comforts; to the press for their ready help, by their good reports, and their assistance in many directions in making our work the easier.

It is a pleasure to recognise the valuable assistance of the Hon. Medical Staff, Hon. Oculist, and our Non-Resident Medical Officer; the efficient work of our Superintendent, Matron, Maternity Ward Nurse, and the Working Staff gener-

ally, and the good services of the Secretary and Collector in our office department,

As President I have appreciated the co-operation and ready help of my colleagues, the Officers and Members of Committee on the Board of Management. Their regular attendance at our meetings, their thorough and efficient visiting work, and their general ungrudging service, have made my work as President lighter and pleasanter to a degree I cannot myself fully estimate.
