The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting the following report for the year ending 30th June, 1910.

1.—THE ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 246.76, being 41 less than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1910, was 131 males, 64 females; total, 195; being a decrease of 70 males and 16 females as compared with the previous year.

The daily average number of inmates during the year was 246.76, as against 287.76 for the previous year. The

average cost of maintenance per head was £20 18s. 1¾d. as against £18 12s. 1¾d. last year.

## 2.—LYING-IN-HOSPITAL.

The number admitted to the Lying-in-Hospital during the year was 38 adults, 5 adults and 4 children remaining from last year; total, 43 adults. 38 children were born, viz., 21 males and 17 females. 41 adults and 39 children were discharged; 1 adult and 2 children died. The number remaining in the hospital on 30th June, 1910, was 1 adult and 1 child. The average period which adults spent in hospital was 27.67 days.

## 3.—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended in Out-door Relief during the year was £940 8s. 10d., showing a decrease of £36 19s. 8d. as compared with last year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1910, was 131.69 adults and 125.54 children; total, 257.23; and for the previous year was 138.42 adults and 107.17 children; total, 245.60; being a decrease of 6.73 adults and an increase of 18.37 children; total increase of adults and children, 11.63. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child was £3 13s. 1¼d, and per week, 1s. 4¾d., as against £3 19s. 7¼d., and per week, 1s 6¾d. for the previous year. The total number of persons on the books in-door and out-door on the 30th June, 1910, was 432, as against 563 for 1909.

## 4.—FINANCIAL.

The Statement of Receipts and Expenditure, as shown below, for the year beginning July 1st, 1909, to June, 30th, 1910, has been duly audited and certified by your Auditors.

The Committee has been obliged to encroach upon the Reserve Funds to the extent of £1500. This has been rendered necessary by the insufficient collections and receipts. In addition to this the Government Grant was reduced by £297. There has also been an extra expense of £245 incurred in connection with the Compassionate Grants made by the Government.

The Bank Overdraft at the beginning of the year was £601 14s. 9d., and this has been reduced to £84 18s. 9d.

## 5.—SPECIAL DONATIONS AND EFFORTS.

The Committee acknowledge with cordial thanks the following liberal donations and special efforts put forth to assist the funds of the Institution, viz., Independent Order of Rechabites, £30 17s. 10d.; Chinese Gardeners and Hawkers, £27.

## 6.—BEQUESTS.

The bequests received during the year amount to £270 2s.

## 7.—OFFICE-BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF COMMITTEE RETIRING.

This meeting will be required to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and nine Members of Committee, viz., Rev. Dr. T. R. Cairns, and Messrs. Jas. Oddie, Wm. Scott, G. K. Coutts, C. E. Grainger, L. Lederman, J. Drummond, W. D. Thompson, and R. J. McVitty, who retire by effluxion of time; also Mr. T. P. Long, retiring president; and a member in place of Mr. R. Maddern, who retired during the year. The three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors also retire, and offer themselves for re-election.

## 8.—GENERAL.

The Committee deeply regret the removal by death of Mr. George Lovitt, one of the oldest members of this Committee, who always took a keen interest in the management of the Institution and the well-being of its inmates.

The Committee desires to direct attention to the extraordinary increase in the expenditure due to the Compassionate Allowances made by the Government. These allowances have grown to an unexpectedly large amount, as shown above. Under the conditions imposed by the State Treasurer it is required that each recipient of a compassionate allowance from the Government shall be assisted also from the funds of this Institution, either in cash or with rations. The Compassionate Allowance is practically an Invalid's Pension, and has been the means of assisting a large number of very deserving cases, which would not have been reached by any other means. In addition to the expenditure of £245 8s. 8d. from the funds of this Institution, the members of the Committee and the Secretary have given a great deal of time and attention to the work of inquiring and the fortnightly distributing of the allowances.

Acknowledgment is due to the many kind friends of the inmates who have provided entertainments, books, and papers, and many creature comforts. The ministers of the churches and other visitors who have attended to the spiritual welfare of the inmates also deserve our best thanks. The local press are especially to be thanked for the kindly assistance freely given to help the good cause of charity.

I desire to particularly recognise the valuable assistance rendered by our Honorary Officers, viz., the Hon. Medical Officers, the Hon. Oculist, and the Hon. Solicitor, Mr. Pinkerton, who has devoted a great deal of his time and ability to the interests of the Institution.

The Officers of the Institution deserve your best thanks for their loyal and careful execution of their various duties. Owing to the admirable work of the paid staff we may justly claim that no Benevolent Asylum can show a healthier and happier condition than this Institution.

In conclusion, I desire to thank this Committee for the ready and courteous assistance which I have had during my term of office as President.

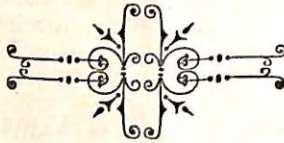
