For the Year Ending 30th June, 1911.

*To the Governors and Subscribers,—*

The Committee presents its Fifty-fourth Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1911, duly audited.

The revenue for the year is £4878 5s. 4d., and the expenditure £5908 3s., showing a deficiency of £1029 17s. 8d.; this, together with the overdraft from the previous year of £84 18s. 9d., making our overdraft at the close of this financial year £1114 16s. 5d.

I.—THE ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 198·87, being 47·89 less than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1911, was—129 males, 89 females; total 218, being a decrease of 2 males and an increase of 25 females, as compared with the previous year.

The daily average number of inmates during the year was 198·87, as against 246·76 for the previous year. The average cost of maintenance per head was £23 9s. 0½d., as against £20 18s 1¾d. last year.

## 2.—LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number admitted to the Lying-in Hospital during the year was 50 adults, 1 adult and one child remaining from last year—total, 51 adults. Forty-four children were born, viz., 17 males and 27 females. Forty-five adults and 42 children were discharged. The number remaining in the Hospital on the 30th June, 1911, was 6 adults and 3 children. The average period of time spent by the adults in the Hospital was  $31\frac{1}{3}$  days.

## 3.—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended on out-door relief during the year was £777 6s. 4d., showing a decrease of £163 2s. 6d. as compared with last year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1911, was 96·84 adults, and 88·64 children—total, 185·48. And for the previous year 131·69 adults, and 125·54 children, being a decrease of 34·85 adults, and 36·90 children; total decrease of adults and children of 71·75. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child; was £4 3s. 9½d., and per week 1s. 7½d.; as against £3 13s. 1½d., and per week 1s. 4½d. for the previous year. The total number on the books, in-door and out-door, on the 30th June, was 371, as against 432 for last year.

## 7.—OFFICE BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF COMMITTEE RETIRING.

This meeting will be required to elect a President, two vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and eight members of Committee, viz.—Messrs. J. N. Dunn, A. Ronaldson, A. Levy, A. J. Pittard, and D. B. Wheeler, who retire by effluxion of time; also Mr. S. Marks, Mr. I. Pearce, the retiring President and vice-presidents, and Mr. Thos. Loughlin, who was appointed by the Committee during the year to the vacancy caused by the death of Mr. Jas. Oddie; the three hon. medical officers, hon. oculist, hon. solicitor, and two auditors, who offer themselves for re-election.

## GENERAL REPORT.

The Committee deeply regret the loss sustained by the Institution during this year, namely, the death of the late Mr. Jas. Oddie. The deceased gentleman served on this Committee since 1857, being President for several terms. He was also Life Governor of this Institution. We can ill afford to lose such men.

It was found necessary to renovate the female sick ward and Lying-in Hospital. The same has been carried out to our satisfaction, and is much approved by Dr. McGowan and the staff, and also by the patients generally.

It was urgently requested by the Treasurer (the Hon. Mr. Watt) to arrange for female nurses in the men's sick ward. We found it would be impossible to carry out this request unless a number of the infirm inmates who are in the sick ward could be moved to the upper rooms, and that could only be done by having a lift to carry them up and down. Your Committee therefore deputed your President to arrange an interview with the Hon. Mr. Watt. A deputation, consisting of Rev. Dr. Cairns, Dr. McGowan and the President, introduced by Mr. A. McKissock, M.L.A., and the Hon. R. McGregor, M.L.A., were received by the Minister most courteously, and after explaining their requirements he kindly promised them £400 towards the cost of the lift. Tenders were at once invited, and under the supervision of Mr. Thursfield, the contractors (Messrs. Edmiston and O'Neil) have erected the same. We feel sure it will prove a great convenience.



Finding that the reserve fund was too much encroached on, your President suggested a Carnival to be held for the benefit of the institution, which was acted upon, with the gratifying result that our funds benefited to the amount of £154. A number of ladies came to our help, and to their efforts are due £53 15s, of same. In recognition thereof your committee appointed Mrs. S. Marks Life Governor; and also Miss Shoppee, who acted as hon. Secretary to the ladies. To assist this object, T. Loughlin, Esq., donated £20 as prize money.

The inmates were regaled by a sumptuous dinner and a good supply of tobacco on the Coronation day, towards which the Government kindly contributed a fair share. The City Band, under the leadership of their conductor, Mr. Galway, gave some appropriate and lively selections of music, which cheered the old people, and was fully appreciated.

We acknowledge with many thanks the kindness of the City Band in giving the inmates an afternoon concert; also Mr. Gude and his orchestra, and all others, for their efforts in entertaining the old folk. We likewise thank the Ministers of various denominations for their spiritual attention to the inmates at all times, and those who liberally provided for the sick and infirm with dainties, reading matter, and other comforts during the year.

The local Press has our best thanks for its assistance in calling special attention to various events for the benefit of our Institution, and their courtesy on all occasions.

We are pleased to note the success of the Superintendent, Mr. Shoppee, regarding the cultivation of the garden. Not only has there been a saving of at least £100 in vegetables during the year, but the sale of potatoes grown by him will leave a handsome profit. At the same time the grounds have been kept in perfect good order, to the delight of all visitors.

I desire to bring under your notice the valuable assistance, rendered at all times when required by the Hon. Medical Staff. Thanks are due to the non-resident Surgeon, Dr. McGowan, who is unremitting in his attention to the inmates. I also thank the Hon. Solicitor, Mr. Pinkerton, who is ever ready to give his time and the best of his ability for the benefit of the Institution.

The Superintendent, Secretary, Matron, Nurses, and Staff, also deserve your best thanks for carrying out their duties faithfully and well.

A number of subscribers having ceased their contributions, and others having reduced theirs, we would appeal to their better feelings to consider the old inmates in the Institution who cannot help themselves, and trust to have a number of new names added to our list during the coming year.

In conclusion, as President, I thank my Committee for the assistance and courtesy to me at all times. I can faithfully state that I have tried my best on all occasions to do justice in my position to the duties allotted to me. The work of the year has been fairly arduous, but whenever there has been good results I have derived the greatest pleasure. Although my year of office has ended, as long as it is the desire of the members to have me on their committee, I trust, by the will of God, to do all in my power to assist this noble Institution to continue in the good work which it has so long carried on.

## Farm and Garden Report.

---

*To the President and Committee.*

GENTLEMEN,—

In accordance with your instructions I have the honor to submit a report of the yield of potatoes from the garden and farm.

As stated in my report of May 22nd, the garden yielded 16½ tons of potatoes, valued at £40. The digging at the farm has now been completed, and results in a yield of 305 bags, or about 21 tons, valued at, say £60.

Our operations have been seriously impeded by the bad weather, and in some instances the potatoes have suffered by the wet.

Since May 1st I have supplied the Institution with our own grown potatoes, and still continue to supply the inmates with all other vegetables at considerably under £1 per week. This low cost is due to my buying in the open market. The quantity of potatoes we have sold or consumed have returned nearly £100.

As you are aware, the season has been particularly unfavourable to the growing of potatoes throughout the district, and therefore I anticipate with an average year a much better return next year. I shall be able to furnish you with a detailed report of the second year of my management of the garden in September next.
