FIFTY-NINTH REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF  
MANAGEMENT

OF THE

**Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and  
Lying-in Hospital**

(INCORPORATED).

For the Year ending 30th June, 1916.

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

In accordance with the Annual custom, your Committee have the honor to lay before you for your consideration the Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1916.

**Financial.**

The income for the year was £5940 11s. 5d., and the expenditure £5700 4s. 11d., being £240 6s. 6d. less than the receipts, thus leaving an overdraft of £1085 3s. 10d.. as compared with the overdraft of 30th June, 1915, of £1295 5s. 4d.

The amount of £240 shown on the balance-sheet as a surplus to credit on the year's business is not a real credit to the funds. During the year the sum of £296 was received from the Government on account of the smoke-house, which was built last year. The whole of the expense for this building was paid out of the funds of the institution, and the Government granted the amount in moieties. The £296 shown was the second instalment of this amount. In addition, the amount of £300 was received from a bequest nearly three years ago, but the settlement of the estate was made this year. It will thus be seen that the Asylum's receipts have been some £500 less than the expenses for the year.

**1—Asylum**

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 212.88, being 5.44 less than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on 30th June, 1916, was 199, being an increase of 2 as compared with the previous year.

### 2---Lying-in Hospital

The number admitted to the Lying-in Hospital during the year was 36 adults, (3 remaining in from previous year), total 39. 34 children were born (12 males, 22 females). Two children died. The average period of time spent by the adults in the Hospital was 26.78 days.

### 3--Out-Door Relief.

The amount expended in Out-Door Relief during the year was £700 5s. 10d., an increase of £109 12s. 7d., as compared with last year, in consequence of higher prices of provisions.

The average number of recipients weekly for the year ended 30th June, was 119.09, being an increase of 8.46. The average cost per head was £6 17s. 6½d., as against £6 2s. 7¼d. the previous year. 329 meals were supplied to travellers at the value of 4d. per head.

Total number of people on the books, in-door and out-door, on the 30th June, was 422, being a reduction of 88.

It will be the business of the meeting to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer, and nine members of Committee, viz.—Messrs. C. W. Growcott, G. K. Coutts, J. McLeod, T. P. Long, A. Levy, Rev. Father Kennelly, Rev. John Walker (who retire by affluxion of time,) W. M. Thompson and J. W. Truswell. Mr. J. Lawn having retired from the Committee, it will be necessary to elect one member to fill his place

Mr. J. W. Truswell was appointed during the year by the Committee and together with the retiring President, the three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon Dentist, and two Auditors offer themselves for re-election.



### General.

The year just closed has been a difficult one owing to the high cost of all commodities used in the Institution, causing a severe strain on our resources.

A slight improvement is shown in our private collections for the year for which we have to thank the subscribers and our energetic Collector, Mr. W. Palmer.

The death occurred during the year of our late Secretary, Mr. T. C. Coates. Mr. Coates had served the Institution as Collector and Secretary first, then as Secretary for a term of 26 years, with very great satisfaction to this Committee. On the amalgamation of the positions of Secretary and Superintendent, Mr. Coates was appointed Assistant Secretary which office he filled for a further term of 3 years, he died at the ripe age of 85 years and was buried at Buninyong. The President, Hon. Treasurer, and several members of the Committee and the Secretary and Supt. attended the funeral.

Owing to the very dilapidated condition of the kitchen and cooking plant, it became imperative that something should be done to improve this state of affairs. Your Committee approached the Premier, Sir Alex. Peacock, requesting that the Government would provide a sum of money for the purpose of renovating the Kitchen, installing a new cooking plant, also the installation of Hot Water, and radiator system, to improve the comfort of the inmates. After several interviews, Sir Alex. Peacock informed your Committee that the sum of £1,000 had been allocated by the Government, so that the work might be carried out. Your Committee immediately proceeded with the necessary alterations. The Hot Water System will be carried to all parts of the Institution and Radiators installed in the Sick Wards; when completed, this will add considerably to the comfort of the inmates, provide better cooked meals, and ensure greater economy and efficiency. I desire to place on record the splendid assistance rendered us by the Hon. F. Brawn, M.L.C who was most untiring in his efforts to secure the above grant.

During the year a very necessary alteration was made between the Female Sick Ward and the Ormond Ward, which will make the work of the nurses easier, and at the same time provide a more private sitting and dining room for them.

During the year Mr. J. Lawn retired from the Committee and Mr. J. W. Truswell was appointed for the balance of the term in his stead.

On behalf of the Inmates, I desire to tender sincere thanks to all visiting friends both Clergy and Lay, who give valuable services to the inmates, ministering to their spiritual and material comforts, also for the enjoyable entertainments provided on many occasions which helped to make the lives of our old folks brighter and happier. To the local press, I desire to tender special thanks for their kindly sympathy and for the publicity given to our reports during the past year.

The Committee has much pleasure in recognising the excellent manner in which the Secretary and Superintendent and Matron (Mr. and Mrs. Burrow) have carried out their respective duties, and are deserving of special mention, also the valued services rendered by each and all of our staff of Officers, and the workers. The Hon. Medical Staff, Hon Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, Hon. Dentist, Nurses, Stewards, Collector, and Working Staff generally, all have had the best interests of the Institution at heart and have done what they could to make this Institution as good as any in the Commonwealth.

As President I desire to thank the Officers and Members of Committee for their splendid assistance they have accorded me during my term of office.
