SIXTIETH REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in Hospital

(Incorporated).

For the Year ending 30th June, 1917.

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

In accordance with the annual custom, your Committee have the honor to lay before you for your consideration the Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1917.

FINANCIAL.

The income for the year was £5446 12s. 5d., and the expenditure £5587 18s. 11d., being £141 6s. 6d. more than the receipts. The overdraft now amounts to £1213 13s. 10d., as compared with the overdraft of 30th June, 1916, of £1085 3s. 10d.

1—ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 191.31, being 21.57 less than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on 30th June, 1917, was 182, a decrease of 17 as compared with the previous year.

2—LYING-IN-HOSPITAL.

The number admitted to the Lying-in Hospital was 26 adults (six remaining in from previous year); total, 32. 25 children were born (14 males, 11 females). 5 infants were born outside, and came in with their mothers.

3—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended on Out-Door Relief during the year was £495 14s., a decrease of £204 11s. 10d. as compared with last year.

The average number of recipients weekly for the year ended 30th June was 78.63, being a decrease of 40.46. The average cost per head was £6 6s., as against £5 17s. 6½d. the previous year. 227 meals were supplied to travellers at the value of 5d. per head. Total number of people on the books, in-door and out-door, on the 30th June was 299, being a reduction of 123..

7—OFFICE-BEARERS.

It will be the business of the meeting to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer, and nine Members of Committee, viz., Messrs. J. N. Dunn, I. Pearce, S. Marks, C. H. Eyres, E. H. Price, A. J. Pittard, W. Hoare, Rev. Father Kerin, who retire by effluxion of time. The two last-named were appointed during the year by the Committee, and together with the retiring President (Mr. J. Tulloch), the three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Dentist, and two Auditors, offer themselves for re-election. It also is necessary to appoint an Hon. Oculist in place of the late Dr. Guthiel.

GENERAL.

Notwithstanding the reduced number of inmates and out-door recipients, the cost of maintenance has been very heavy. This is due to the increased cost of provisions and clothing.

By exercising the greatest care, the Superintendent has fed and clothed those dependent upon this Asylum at only a comparatively slight increase upon the cost of previous years.

The money spent upon installing the new steam cooking plant and hot water service and radiators throughout the wards have been justified by our experience during the last six months. As a result, the inmates are provided with meals in greater variety and served hot, which was impossible under the old system.

The hospital wards are greatly improved by the radiators maintaining an even temperature, with better ventilation.

Much repairing work is necessary throughout the building. The roofing is showing evidence of want of repair, and the window frames generally need a thorough overhaul. It will be necessary during the ensuing year for the Committee to undertake these repairs.

The death of Dr. Guthiel, our Hon. Oculist, during the year removed a valued and conscientious officer, whose professional services were always at the disposal of the inmates. It will be the duty of the subscribers to appoint a successor to the late Dr. Guthiel at the annual meeting.

Dr. J. K. Richards, one of the Hon. Physicians, volunteered for Active Service at the Front, and was granted leave of absence.

The Rev. John Walker also volunteered for service at the Front as Chaplain to the A.I.F., and was granted leave of absence from Committee meetings.

By reason of removal from Ballarat, the Rev. Father Kennelly resigned from the Committee, and the Rev. Father Kerin was appointed in his place. Mr. Truswell also retired from the Committee, and Mr. W. Hoare was elected to fill the vacancy.

In acknowledging the valued services of the visiting clergy and lay preachers, I have to express the thanks of the inmates for the attention given them in regard to their religious duties.

Special thanks are due to many kind friends who have entertained the inmates throughout the year, and particular reference must be made to Mrs. Ruffle and friends, Mr. McCallum and friends, and Miss Wotherspoon, of Beaufort, who provided a delightful tea at different times for the inmates every year.

The local Press has, as ever, been extremely helpful in bringing the needs of the Institution prominently before the public.

It is my pleasing duty to record the careful and kindly attention of the Secretary and Superintendent, Mr. C. H. Burrow, the Matron, Mrs. Burrow, and the Assistant Secretary, Miss Burrow.

The Committee is fortunate in possessing the services of Mr., Mrs. and Miss Burrow, and a cordial acknowledgment should also be given to Mrs. Wells for valuable assistance in a variety of ways.

The paid staff and the honorary staff of officers give unremitting care to the requirements of the inmates. The services of Dr. McGowan and Mr. T. P. Wilson (Hon. Dentist) deserve special acknowledgment. Mr. F. Pinkerton, the Hon. Solicitor, has been extremely helpful on all occasions when legal assistance has been required, and the Committee's best thanks are due to him for his services.

In conclusion, I desire to express my thanks to the Committee for their cordial co-operation in managing the affairs of the Institution.
