# SIXTY-FOURTH REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

## BALLARAT DISTRICT BENEVOLENT ASYLUM AND LYING-IN HOSPITAL

(Incorporated)

For the Year ending 30th June, 1921.



### TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

In accordance with the annual custom your Committee have the honor to lay before you for your consideration the Report and Balance-Sheet for year ended 30th June, 1921.

### Financial

The income for the year was £7,497 19s 10d, and the expenditure £7,474 11s 10d, being £23 8s less than the receipts. The overdraft now amounts to £403 6s 7d, as compared with the overdraft of £431 14s 7d on June 30, 1920.

### 1.—Asylum

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 174.24, being 3.80 less than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on June 30, 1921, was 172, as against 170 last year.

The average annual cost per head for maintenance was £39 14s 9½d, as against £33 5s 7½d for the previous year, an increase of £6 9s 2d.

### 2.—Lying-in Hospital

The number admitted to the Lying-in Hospital was 50. 47 children were born, 18 males and 26 females. There were three still born males. One baby girl died nine days old.



### 3—Out-Door Relief

The amount expended on Out-Door Relief was £473 10s, as compared with £502 9s 9d last year, a decrease of £28 19s 8d. The average number of recipients weekly for the year ended 30th June, 1921, was 65.23, as against 92.01 last year, a decrease of 26.78. The average cost per head was £7 5s 2d, as against £5 9s 1d the previous year. 247 meals were supplied to travellers at the value of 6d. per head. Total number of people on the books in-door and out-door on 30th June, 1921, was 315, a decrease of 45 on last year.

Nicholson, W. J. Carthew, and W. R. Redpath, who retire by effluxion of time, and offer themselves for re-election, together with the retiring President (Very Rev. John Walker). It will also be necessary to elect Hon. Solicitor, four Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Dentist, and two Auditors.

### 8—Life Governors

The Committee recommend the following names be placed on the list of Life Governors:—Mr Thomas Dickinson, £25, Miners' Turf Club; Mr E. Lanigan and J. Murphy, £40, Police and Postman's Sports.



## REVIEW OF THE YEAR'S WORK.

The operations of this Public Institution have been carried on with care and zeal, as in previous years. The Board is *not* made up of "Rubber Stamps," but of men who take a true interest in the Benevolent Asylum and all its inmates. During the year we have lost the valued services of Messrs A. W. Hager and James Tulloch, the former after 20 years of faithful work as a member of the Board, and the latter 10 years. Messrs W. R. Redpath and A. E. Nicholson have been elected to succeed them.

**COST OF MAINTENANCE.**—Despite the most careful and watchful management, the cost of maintenance has further advanced. In the year 1919-20 the cost per head per year was £33 5s 7½d; in 1920-21, it was £39 14s 9½d. This emphasizes the need of more liberal support by the public. We are very grateful to regular subscribers; also for legacies which come to us from deceased friends who valued the work of this Institution, and remembered it when making their wills.

**STRUCTURAL REPAIRS.**—The Works Committee has given much attention to the state of the buildings. An Architect's report and a report of the Government Architect were obtained, which made it clear that a considerable sum should be at once spent on repairs and in providing more accommodation for the staff. Accompanied by Messrs Price, Oliver, and Long, I waited upon the Hon. W. M. McPherson, Treasurer of Victoria, in Melbourne, when we set forth the needs of the Benevolent Asylum buildings, and made an earnest request for a grant of £ for £ on the necessary expenditure. The State members for Ballarat West and East supported our appeal. The Treasurer admitted the need, but for various reasons postponed the matter. The Board then decided to carry out the most pressing repairs by day labour. One section has been successfully completed, and further work will be immediately undertaken.

**HELPERS.**—Very sincere thanks are due, as in previous years, to the clergymen who have conducted religious services, and visited the inmates, and to all who by visits and various kind means, have cheered the old folk; to the Entertainment Committee who have been as active as ever; to Miss Beccie McDonald, who was instrumental in obtaining 50 bed-boxes for the sick wards; to donors of clothes, etc.; and to the young ladies of the Baptist Church for supplying cakes and pastry to the old women every Sunday.

**OFFICIALS.**—The Benevolent Asylum is splendidly served by its Officers. The Superintendent is not a mere official, but a father and friend to the old people; the Matron and Staff are devoted and unselfish in the discharge of their often trying duties. The Board, the Subscribers, as well as the inmates are highly favoured in possessing a Matron and Staff who put so much heart into their duties. Our Doctor is not only capable but is really interested in his work, and his geniality makes him the friend of all. The Collector is keen and energetic, and has succeeded wonderfully, considering the times. We have learnt with much regret of the death of Nurse Freestone, who gave 20 years of faithful service to the Institution. Her funeral was attended by the Treasurer and Superintendent representing the Board.

**HONORARY STAFF.**—We are deeply grateful to those gentlemen who professionally serve the Institution so generously and so well. Our Hon. Legal Adviser, Mr Pinkerton, does a great deal of work, involving much time, gladly and without charge. We continue to be indebted to our Hon. Medical Officers:—Drs. J. K. Richards, J. M. Gardiner, and W. A. Spring, and to Dr. Affleck Scott (Oculist), and Mr T. P. Wilson (Dentist), for their kind and valuable services. During the year the offer by Dr. W. H. Barker of his services as Honorary Consultant in Mental cases, was gladly accepted. We are indeed fortunate in our Treasurer, who for long years has proved himself as zealous for the Institution, as he is effective and watchful in its service.

**THE PRESS.**—The Ballarat Press has been most helpful, giving sympathetic reports of the meetings of the Board and of all that concerns the wel-



fare of the Institution. The proprietors of the, Star," and "Courier," and the "Argus" and "Age" have supplied copies of their papers free.

THE GARDEN reflects great credit on the Superintendent, and is both beautiful and very remunerative. The flower garden makes the Institution home-like; and the inmates have always an abundant supply of vegetables of the best quality from our own grounds.

OUR VETERAN.—Mr Thomas Thompson, who has resided in our Institution for some years, reached his 107th birthday on Sunday, 26th June, and is still able to get about and has all his faculties and considerable interest in life. He had many visitors with birthday presents and congratulations; as President, I visited the old gentleman, and offered him the hearty felicitations of the Board. The inmates were given a birthday tea in honor of the unique occasion.

CHANGE OF NAME.—Following the trend of kindly consideration for the feelings of the old and sick folk, who from time to time are our guests, the Board recommend to the Annual Meeting of subscribers, that the name of the Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in-Hospital, shall henceforth be "THE BALLARAT DISTRICT BENEVOLENT HOMES AND MATERNITY HOSPITAL." We also recommend that the governing body of the Benevolent Homes shall hereafter be known as the BOARD instead of the COMMITTEE.

FILIAL INGRATITUDE.—The time has come when a public and solemn protest should be made because of the absence of filial piety of which we too frequently have shocking cases in connection with the Benevolent Asylum and elsewhere. An aged widow lived for some years in the Institution. She had eight married children. They contributed nothing to her support; allowed her to be buried at the public cost, and neither child nor grandchild attended the funeral. Neither is this case an isolated one. The selfish neglect of aged parents seems, alas! to be growing, and is a crime against humanity.

IN CONCLUSION, I venture to appeal to the public of Ballarat and District for continued and increased support to this invaluable and well-ordered Institution. Shakespeare makes King Lear describe himself as "a poor, infirm, weak, and despised old man." It is a description of a tragic state. Around such men and women we seek to throw the strong and tender arms of a kindly, sympathetic, comforting guardianship. But when there are many such, and when the price of food and clothing is high, a large and regular income is necessary. But let it be remembered that the exercise of practical mercy blesses both giver and receiver, and is a notable factor in the building up of a truly great nationhood. Lord Bacon's rendering of a Scripture Text is most suggestive: "Knowledge bloweth up, BUT CHARITY BUILDETH UP!" I regret having had to be away from Ballarat on professional duty for some three months of my year of office, and thank Mr Oliver, and the Members of the Board for their helpful services in my absence, and for all the support, courtesy and consideration which I have received during the year from all of my colleagues.
