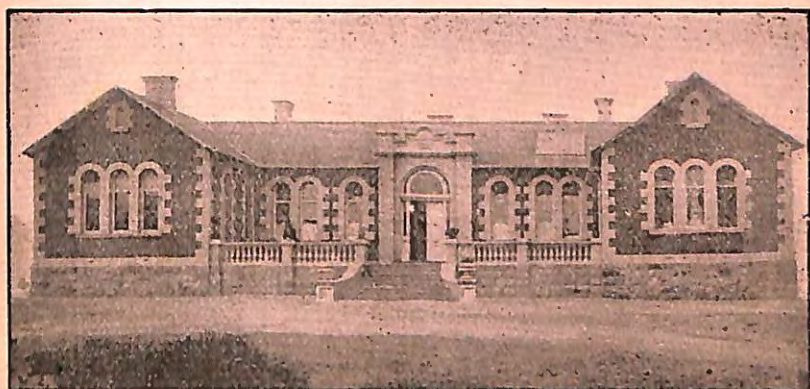

ANNUAL REPORT

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS—

The Committee of Management have the honor to submit to the contributors of the Stawell Hospital & Benevolent Asylum their Fifty-sixth Annual Report and Balance Sheet, for the year ended, 30th June, 1915.

The Financial Statement, which is printed herewith, duly audited and certified shows ordinary income £1501 7s. 8d, extraordinary income £206 9s. 7d., or a total of £1707 17s. 3d. The Government has redeemed £300 of inscribed stock at par, this amount has been paid into the current account. It is pleasing to note that most of the sources of income have increased as compared with last year notably, private contributions by £5 3s 11d Hospital Sunday, £9 9s. 11d., Out-patients fees, £2 6s. 3d., In-patients fees, £70 6s. od., Donations, £77 7s. 7d.

Under extraordinary income we received £25, from Stawell Athletic Club, £40, from the Edward Wilson Trustees, £20, from the Felton Bequest trustees. Other donations have been received as follows:—Collection Stawell Show, £5 1s. ; Extrs of the late Mrs Humphreys, £92 9s 7d ; Snow Flake Minstrels, £12 18s 0d ; Halls Gap Concert, £4 ; Pomonal Sports, £3 ; Glynwylh Ball, £9 12s 6d. Owing mainly to the increase in the cost of provisions, in Surgery and Dispensary, Expenditure, and Wages to domestic help, and also to a larger number of patients being treated than previously, the expenditure throughout the year has shown a considerable increase on that of last year, notwithstanding, that strictest economy has been practised. The amount of good work done in any department of the Institution has not been lessened or impaired in consequence, the total expenditure was £2027 4s. 7d., the principal items showing an increase are, meat, £25 2s. 7d. ; milk, £58 14s. 3d ; drugs, £79 3s. 9d ; wages £40 13s. 7d.

The present credit bal. is £384 7s 7d, against this accounts amounting to £217 19s 1d owing 30th June, 1915 have to be deducted. Your Bankers hold £448 face value of 3 per cent. government inscribed stock (1917 optional) the present market value being £328.

The Premier, Sir A. J. Peacock, paid a visit to Stawell and delivered an address on Hospital Sunday, the 22nd November, 1914, he also visited the Institution the next day when your com-

mittee brought several matters under his notice, amongst these was the alterations and additions to the buildings which were required. The committee were given to understand that these would be carried out. An inspector and an architect have been up and plans and an estimate have been prepared and submitted to the committee, the cost is £1815.

The Resident Surgeon, Dr. Jamieson, has volunteered and been accepted as one of the Surgeons at one of the base hospitals in England, your committee have granted him leave of absence during their pleasure. Dr. Thos. Stanton has been appointed as acting Resident Surgeon.

The grateful acknowledgements of the committee are tendered to the members of the different sub-committee's for their practical assistance, and the honorary professional staff for their attention to those under their care, and to the Resident Surgeon, Matron and Staff for the efficient manner in which they have carried out their duties; also to the committee of the Mechanics' Institute for free use of reading room; to the proprietors of the following newspapers for free copies supplied—the Argus, Leader, Ballarat Star, Weekly Times, Southern Cross, Ararat Advertiser, Stawell News, Stawell Times; to the young ladies who collected at the Stawell Show, to the Horsham Pierrot Company for the splendid concert given at Stawell, and the local ladies for the sale of sweets at the concert, the nett amount of £39 6s. 10d. being received by this concert; and to all others who have in any way helped to promote the good and great work of caring for the sick and suffering men and women who have in the past year received the benefit of the Institution.

To assist the efforts to duly care for the needs of wounded and sick soldiers returning from the War the committee has placed 20 beds at the disposal of the Government.

The committee express the confident hope that the claims of this Institution on the charity of its subscribers will in the coming year, as in all the past years of its existence, be recognised and its sphere of usefulness to the sick and aged be fully maintained.
