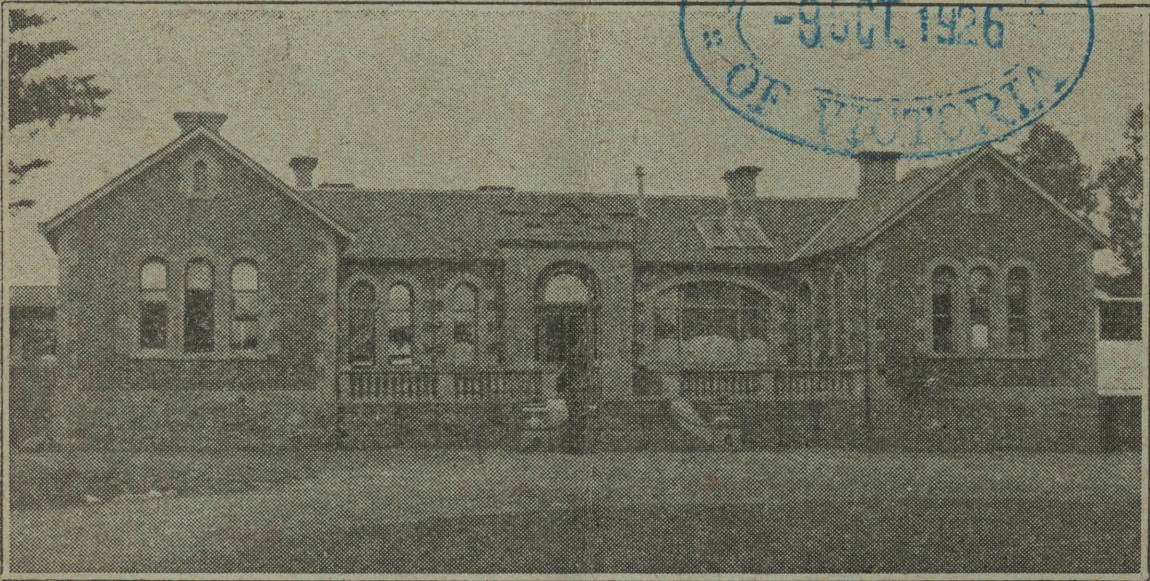

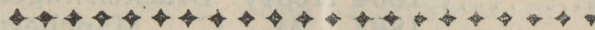

Sixty-Sixth Annual Report

Of the

Stawell and District Hospital.



To the Subscribers.—

The Committee of Management of the Stawell and District Hospital have the honor to submit to the Subscribers the sixty-sixth Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the financial year ended June 30th, 1925. The Receipts from all sources for the year just ended amount to £2394/2/5 and the Expenditure to £2704/11/1, leaving an overdraft of £360/12/6 at the Union Bank at the end of the financial year. The Committee desires to express its appreciation of the liberal support given by the public to the various appeals made throughout the year on behalf of the Hospital.

The following amounts were received during the year :— Christmas Cheer Donations, £30/14/6; Stawell Athletic Club, £75 ; Sir W. A. Zeal's Estate, per Perpetual Trustees Association, £5; Joseph Kronheimer's Estate, per Equity Trustees, £5; Patrick Brennan's Estate, per National Trustees, £40; Edward Wilson's Charitable Fund, per the "Argus" Office, £50; Alfred Felton's Charitable Fund, per Trustees Executors and Agency Company, £30; Stawell Brass Band Collections, £466/15/4; Sale of Hospital Buttons, £31/10/3; Landsborough Race Club, £7/15/0; Great Western Race Club, £5/10/7; Edward Simmons' Trustees, £45; Mr and Mrs F. J. Cato Endowment Interest, £50; Estate late Thomas Barker, £25; Estate of the late Samuel Hamilton, £20; "Bryn Avon," Ball, per Mr C. J. Hutchings, £20/10/; Glenorchy Dance, per Mr Alex. McMorrison, £7; Victorian Railways Institute Dramatic Co. per Mr M. J. Hayes, £9/5/6; Rupanyup Dance, per Mr P. Page, £10; Rupanyup Junior Red Cross, £10, for Cot.

The Government Grant has been increased by £50 for the year.

Miss Carmichael resigned from her position as Sister in November of last year. We appointed Sister Gullan to the position. She commenced duty on December 1st. In May of this year we appointed Sister McDonald, who had finished her training, at the salary of £90 per annum for three months.

The Salaries of the Matron and Sister Gullan were raised to conform with the rates ruling at other Country Hospitals.

The staff is an excellent one and is giving every satisfaction.

We are pleased to report that Nurse McDonald and Nurse Burge passed their R.V.T.N.A. Examinations.

322 In-Patients were treated at the Hospital during the year.

The usual Egg Appeal was made during the year and was again highly satisfactory. A Jam Appeal was also organised and resulted in enough jam being received to carry the Institution on until the fruit season re-commences.

A Special Appeal is being made at the present time to instal a Maternity Ward, Re-model the Nurses' Quarters, and the re-placement of Hot Water Services, etc. A Queen Competition is meeting with success, and it is hoped that the amount needed—£2000— will be raised by the closing date in October. It is hoped that this appeal will not interfere with the usual annual subscriptions, as the Hospital must be maintained.

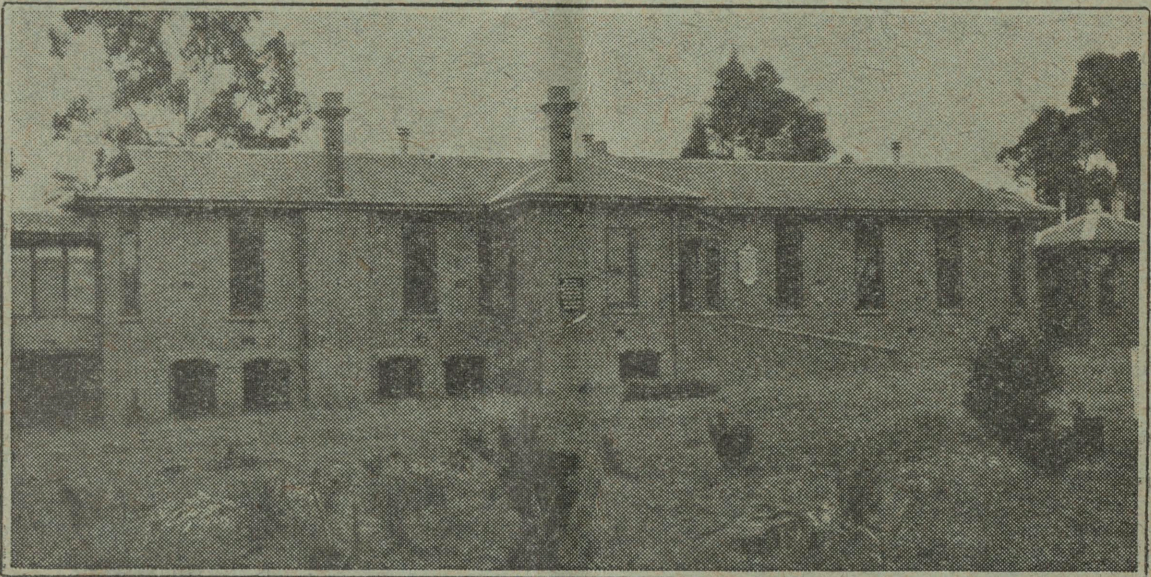
