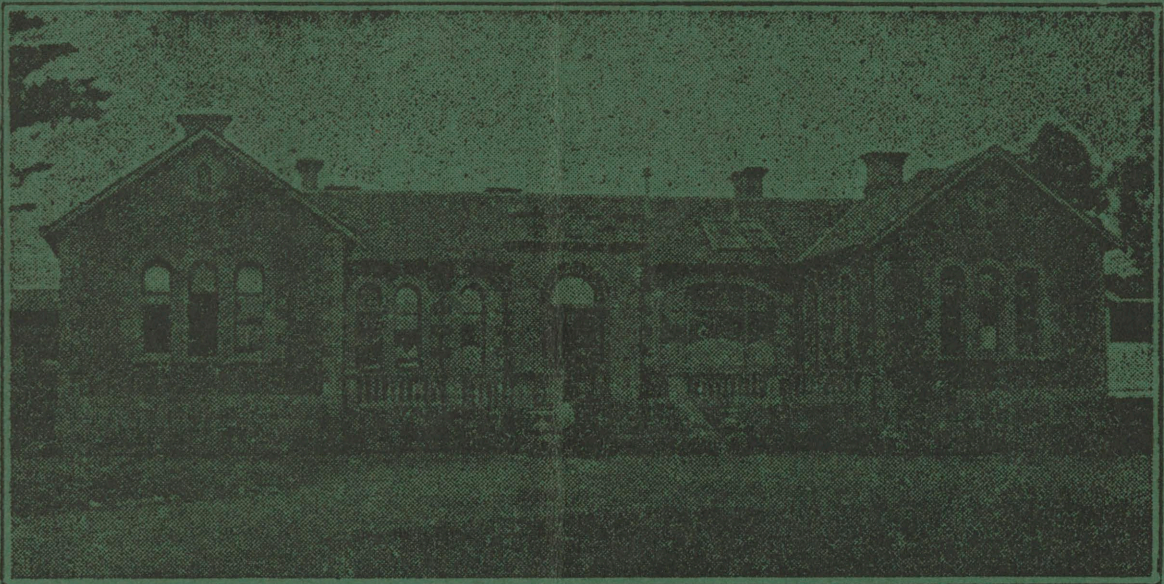

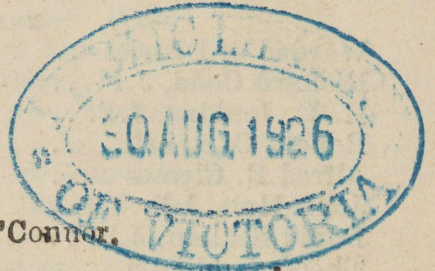

SIXTY - SEVENTH
ANNUAL REPORT
 OF THE
Stawell and District Hospital.

To the Subscribers—

The Committee of Management of the Stawell and District Hospital have the honor to submit to the Subscribers the sixty-seventh Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the financial year ended June 30th, 1926. The Receipts from all sources for the year just ended amount to £2,671 0 9 and Expenditure to £2,705 16 10, leaving an overdraft of £396 8 7 at the Union Bank at the end of the financial Year.

The Committee desires to express its appreciation of the liberal support given by the Public to the various appeals made throughout the year on behalf of the Hospital.

In doing so the Committee wish to make special record of the magnificent result achieved with the Queen Carnival in raising the sum of £3,812 16 4 for the required improvements at the Institution; towards required amount the Government has promised a special grant of £500.

It was decided to re-organise the Gift Afternoon and in the capable hands of the President (Mrs. J. A. Larkan) and her Committee a gratifying result was achieved. Over Forty Pounds in cash and goods to the value of about £80 being received. The Gift Afternoon took place in the Town Hall Stawell on 24th June, 1926.

The Government grant has been increased to £500 but it is felt that a further increase should be solicited.

During the year the annual Wood-bee was held and approximately 200 tons of firewood was cut and carted into the Institution.

The usual Egg and Jam Appeals were held during the year and were again satisfactory.

During the year 396 in-patients and 126 Out-patients were treated at the Institution. The daily average has increased from 18½ in 1925 to 20¼ in 1926.

It is with pleasure that I refer to the Staff which continues to give every satisfaction to both the Committee and Patients.

A pleasing ceremony took place at the Hospital on June 23rd when Members of the Mothers Club of State School No. 502 assembled and presented a fully equipped latest type Hospital Bed.

A scheme organised by Mr. J. O'Connor whereby the District Schools are being approached with a view to installing about 30 beds of a similar type is meeting with great success and it is hoped that the required number of beds will be raised through this scheme.

I beg to state that the work of the year has been most gratifying and I wish to thank the members of the Committee for their support given me, also mentioning the Secretary Mr. G. D. Bell who has worked hard to bring our financial position at the end of the year to a satisfactory state.
